

Why Play?

- Cost of High pressure
 - 50% more health care expense
 - 550 million work days year to stress (37% high absenteeism)
 - 60% more errors and defects
 - 18% lower productivity
 - 16% lower profitability
 - 37% lower job growth
 - 65% lower share price over time





User Story

I, as the Customer, want a tower so I that can view my kingdom

- User Story
 - I, as the Customer, want a tower so I that can view my kingdom
- **Task 1** Create the base
 - Must start with black 4x6 stud piece (thin 1/3 height).

- Task 2 Place the first level
 - Must place green 2x4 stud piece (standard height) so that there are 2 rows of studs on either side and the end reach the sides of the base piece

- Task 3 Place the second level
 - Must place another green 2x4 stud piece (standard height) directly on top of the previous level covering all studs

- Task 4 Place the third level
 - Must place 2 blue 1x4 stud pieces (standard height) directly on top of the previous level covering all the studs

- Task 5 Place the forth level
 - Must place 2 red 1x4 stud pieces (standard height) directly on top of the previous level covering all the studs

- Task 6 Place the fifth level
 - Must place a yellow 2x4 stud piece (standard height) directly on top of the previous level covering all the studs

- Task 7 Place the sixth level
 - Must place 2 grey 1x4 stud arch pieces (standard height) directly on top of the previous level covering all the studs

- **Task 8** Place the top platform
 - Must place the yellow 2x6 stud piece (1/3 height) directly on top

- Task 9 Place red light brick
 - Must attach the 1x2 red light brick

User Story

- I, as the Customer, want a tower so I that can view my kingdom
- Acceptance Criteria:
 - Tower should be supported by the black 4x6 stud base
 - Tower should be at least 6 bricks high but no higher than 10
 - Tower should have a supporting platform on top
 - Top platform should have a brick that warns airplanes
 - Tower should incorporate the colors of the kingdom
